THE SUPERVISORS CAN CALL A MEETING WITHIN 24 HRS SHOULD THE NEED ARISE TO MAKE THE APPOINTMENT PRIOR TO THE APRIL MEETING. AGAIN, I AM REQUESTING TO TABLE TILL APRILS REGULAR MEETING SO THAT I MAY STATE MY COMMENTS AND PRESENT DOCUMENTATION IF NEEDED ON THE CURRENT HOURLY WAGES INCLUDING BENEFITS. PAUL SAID THEN THE CONSERVATION DISTRICT DOES NOT RECOGNIZE IT FOR FUNDING. SUE SAID THAT IS WHAT SHE UNDERSTANDS. PAUL SAID GREG SCHETZLE FROM THE WESTD CONSERVANCY DID MINE BELT CONVERSIONS ABOVE AND BEYOND PUBLIC ACCESS. VAUGHN SAID HE HAS ANOTHER NAME HE WILL TRY TO GET IN TOUCH WITH THIS WEEK-GREG SCHETLZE. PAUL ASKED IF THE BOARD HAS ANY OTHER IDEAS OTHER THAN THE CONSERVATION DISTRICT. SUE SAID IT IS .4 MILE AND THEY WERE LOOKING INTO MAYBE GOING WITH WEST WHEATFIELD TO PIGGYBACK ON ONE OF THEIR BIDS. THEY NEED TO JUSTIFY SPENDING THAT AMOUNT OF PUBLIC MONEY. SUE ASKED WHEN THEY APPOINTED DAN FOR THIS JOB, IS EMMA RETIRING? PAUL SAID NO, IT IS PROACTIVE APPROACH IN THE EVENT SOMETHING HAPPENS TO EMMA BECAUSE THEY GOT STUCK BEFORE. VAUGHN SAID IT WAS A MESS FOR 3 MONTHS LAST YEAR.
