DAVE LUTHER BRENDLINGER 12. TONY ACERIO-HE UNDERSTANDS THE TWP IS PUTTING IN NEW CATCH BASIN. HE ASKED THE DEPTH OF IT TO RECEIVING DEBRIS BEFORE FLOODING. PAUL SAID DEPENDS ON THE ELEVATION OF HIS DRIVEWAY PIPE, IT WILL BE APPROX. 8" OF ABSORPTION AREA. VAUGHN SAID THEY ARE PUTTING ANOTHER BOX BY BERKEY'S TO HAVE 2 CLEAN OUTS. HOPEFULLY IT WILL WORK. TONY ASKED IF CUTTING THE RAVINE TO CATCH THE HILLSIDE WATER, VAUGHN SAID TAKING IT BACK TO THE GRAVEL TO OPEN UP AGAIN. NOT AS STEEP AS BEFORE.
