VIII. NEW BUSINESS: 1. PAUL HAD A PHONE CALL REGARDING TCSA. HE ASKED SOLICITOR TO EXPLAIN SINCE HE WAS THERE. J. MILLER SAID SEWAGE AUTHORITY HAD A MTG LAST NIGHT. THEY ARE REQUIRED TO ATTEND MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENT MEETINGS TO SEE IF THERE ARE ANY CONCERNS. HE SAID THAT OVER A 6 MONTH PERIOD, THEY HAVE HAD 92 INCIDENTS IN FFTWP. NOTHING REAL HEAVY, A FEW BURGLARIES, A FEW CAR CRASHES. HISTORICALLY THIS AREA IS NORMALLY PATROLLED BY 1 GUY FOR AN ENTIRE SHIFT. SECRETARY STATED THAT A FEW YEARS AGO, THERE WERE 2 OFFICERS THAT WERE THE GO TO OFFICERS IF THERE WAS A PROBLEM IN FFTWP, IS HE NOW THAT

OFFICER? HE COULD BE, THERE ARE 3 OF THEM IN THIS AREAS. HE GAVE TWP HIS PHONE NUMBER. ERIC COLT ASKED IF THEY USUALLY HAVE THE SAME PEOPLE IN THIS AREA. TRPR JOHNSON SAID NO. THERE ARE A FEW GUYS THAT LIVE OUT THIS WAY ASKS TO WORK IN THE AREA IN WHICH THEY LIVE IN, BUT THEY DON'T ALWAYS GET THOSE ZONES; BUT THEY DO TRY TO ACCOMMODATE THEM. ERIC COLT SAID DURING THE OFFICER REED INCIDENT, THE POLICE WERE LOST, AND IT WOULD BE NICE IF A COP THAT RAN THIS AREA MORE OFTEN COULD LEARN THE STREETS TRPR. JOHNSON SAID HE DOESN'T KNOW WHAT HE MEANS ABOUT BEING LOST, TRPR DISVONIC WAS THE FIRST ON THE SCENE, AND HE KNEW RIGHT WHERE TO GO. AND THERE WAS A LOT GOING ON WITH SPORADIC INFORMATION; AND HE FELT THAT THEY WERE THERE QUICKLY AND NEW WHERE TO GO. SECRETARY STATED SHE FEELS THE PROBLEM WAS WHEN LISTENING TO THE SCANNERS, THE CELL SERVICE HERE IS INSUFFICIENT. POLICE COULD NOT USE CELL PHONES, AND THE TWP HAS A NEW TOWER, BUT SO FAR NO RECEIVERS ON IT. MAYBE STATE POLICE COULD EXPRESS THE NEED FOR THIS TOWER. TRPR. JOHNSON SAID THEY WOULDN'T REQUEST VERIZON TO PUT A RECEIVER UP. TRPR. JOHNSON STATED THAT GREENSBURG STATION HAS VERY YOUNG STATION, AVERAGE AGE IS PROBABLY 3 TO 3 HALF YEARS OF EXPERIENCE. THERE IS NOT MANY SEASONED GUYS THERE. THE RIGHT GUY WAS WORKING THAT NIGHT. 4. ERIC COLT—COLT ESTATES WOULD LIKE TO CLOSE DOWN FT. PALMER ROAD BELOW THE GAS WELL. HE BELIEVES THERE IS NO RIGHT OF WAY THERE. PAUL ASKED BASED ON WHAT INFORMATION. ERIC SAID ON MAPPING AND DEEDS, HE WOULD LIKE GATES. PAUL SAID HE HAS TRAVELED THAT ROAD FOR 21 YEARS. ERIC SAID IT HAS BEEN OPEN EXCEPT WHEN THE COAL COMPANY WAS IN THERE. ERIC BELIEVES THERE IS A RIGHT OF WAY ISSUE. PAUL ASKED IF TALKING ABOUT FROM OUTSIDE IN SCHOOL. ERIC SAID BELOW THAT, THERE IS A GAS WELL ENTRANCE THERE. ERIC SAID THEY ARE HAVING THEFT IN THE AREA AND AN INDIVIDUAL HAS BEEN SEEN SEVERAL TIMES TRAVELING THE DIRT ROAD. SOLICITOR EXPLAINED WHY IT WON'T HAPPEN. SOLICITOR SAID THAT COLT PROBABLY HAS PROPERTY THAT BORDERS THAT ROAD, COLT SAID ON BOTH SIDES. SOLICITOR EXPLAINED THAT ONE OF THE THINGS HE WILL FIND OUT, THAT EVEN IF YOU DON'T FIND A RIGHT OF WAY OR EASEMENT IN THE DEED. IT CAN STILL EASILY EXIST BY SOMETHING CALLED PRESCRIPTION; AND WHAT THAT MEANS IS BY USE. SAME THING AS SQUATTERS RIGHTS. WHICH IS SAME THING AS IF SOMEONE COMES AND SETS ON YOUR GROUND FOR 21 YRS. AND YOU DON'T PUT THEM OFF AND THEY TREATED IT AS THOUGH IT WAS THEIRS, IT ACTUALLY BECOMES THIERS. THE RIGHT OF WAY NOT THE GROUND.
