V. CORRESPONDENCE: 1. BVFC REQUESTED TO USE THE TWP ROADS FOR THE ANNUAL PARADE ON JULY, 9, 2009: APPR BY VAUGHN, 2ND BY JIM, UNAN-YES. 2. XTO ENERGY NOTICE-NOTIFY TWP THAT XTO'S INTENTION TO WITHDRAW WATER IN OUR MUNICIPALITY, WELL PERMIT APPLICATION, PROPOSED WELL LOCATION, OUTLINE OF TWP'S RIGHTS. PAUL TALKED TO SCOTT HUNTINGTON-XTO ENERGY REP. THE PROPOSED WELL IS LOCATED IN LIGONIER TWP ON SR 259, APPR. 1/2 MILE SOUTH OF TWP LINE. IT IS THEIR INTENTIONS TO TRUCK WATER FROM HIGHRIDGE HYDRANT FROM THE ALLEGHENY FOUNDRY TO WELL SITE ON 259. SOLICITOR SAID IF THEY GET ONTO AN ENGINEERED STUDY ROAD, THERE WOULD BE A BOND ISSUE. SECRETARY ASKED SOLICITOR IF IT WOULD BE IN THE BEST INTEREST OF THE TWP RESIDENTS SERVED BY HIGHRIDGE WATER FOR SUPERVISORS TO SEND A LETTER TO HIGHRIDGE ON BEHALF OF THOSE RESIDENTS. SOLICITOR SAID IT COULD NOT HURT ANYTHING. SECRETARY REQUESTED THE TWP SEND A LETTER ON BEHALF OF THE TWP RESIDENTS. SUPERVISORS SAID OKAY. DEB GAWLAS BROUGHT UP ABOUT PRESSURE AND QUALITY OF WATER DURING THE TIMES OF LARGE EXTRACTIONS. PAUL SAID THAT IS PROBABLY WHY THEY ARE GOING TO THE FOUNDRY LOCATION, IT IS SERVED BY A 20 INCH MAIN, HE DOES NOT THINK IT WILL CAUSE TURBIDITY. SECRETARY ASKED WHY THEY DO NOT TAKE FROM CONEMAUGH RIVER, PAUL SAID PROBABLY THE STREAM ENCROACHMENT.

IN TALKING WITH PENDOT REP, TWP CAN GO WITH ONE SUPPLIER OR PIECE MILL IT AND PICK STONE FROM CHEAPEST SUPPLIER. PAUL STATED THAT IN PUNCHING THE NUMBERS OF THE PRODUCT MOST USED, SUPERVISORS FEEL IT WOULD BE IN THE BEST INTEREST TO AWARD TO CHEAPEST INDIVIDUAL ITEM. VAUGHN STATED THAT IF THE TWP DOES THAT, THEY HAVE TO CONTINUE THAT PRACTICE. SOLICITOR SAID THIS CAME UP LAST YEAR AND HE SUGGESTED THAT WHEN TWP SENDS BIDS OUT TO IDENTIFY WHAT YOU ARE DOING TO THE POTENTIAL

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BIDDER SO THEY KNOW IF IT IS IN WHOLE OR BY PIECE MILL. PAUL HAS THE ADVERTISEMENT FROM COG AND SOLICITOR SAID IT COVERS THE PIECE MILL BID. **MOTION** MADE BY VAUGHN TO AWARD BID TO LOWEST BID IN EACH ITEM **NEW ENTERPRISE ITEMS #1 & 2**; **HANSON AGGREGATE ITEMS #3, 4, 5, 6, 7, &** 8: SECONDED BY JIM, UNAN-YES.
